March 27, 1934. Willcox Man Dies Of Gunshot Wound In Highway Fray. Coroner's Jury Brings in Verdict and Man Who Held Gun Is Freed. Willcox. March 26 (AP) A coroner's jury tonight found that death of **H.T. Hall**, 31, of Willcox, who was slain on the highway 12 miles east of here Sunday night, "resulted from gunshot wounds" inflicted by a "gun in the hands of A.J. Stepp," Phoenix trucker.

Stepp, who had been held by sheriff's deputies pending the investigation, was released, however, on an order from the county attorney's office. His helper, M.C. Dudley, and Joe Hall, brother of the slain man, also were released from custody.

Stepp and Dudley both testified at the inquest that someone—they did not identify the person—attempted to hold them up and fired at them twice with a shotgun, one charge entering the windshield and narrowly missed Stepp. Stepp said he returned the fire as he passed the person.

The windshield of Stepp's truck was broken, one corner of the cab was ripped off, and shot marks were found on the rear. Broken glass was found near bloodstains on the road, together with a flashlight which allegedly had belonged to Hall.

Joe Hall testified that his brother had attempted to stop the truck merely to get help in starting their stalled automobile. He denied that either he or his brother had had a gun with them. No gun was found.

The body of the slain man was brought to Willcox by his wife and his brother.

The shooting occurred about 9 p.m.

## HAMMONS

April 28, 1977. Services Scheduled Here Thursday. Local Man Dies In Shooting. Forty-three-year-old **Howard S. Hammons** was killed Sunday night during a fight at a tavern in Gleeson, Cochise County Undersheriff Doug Knipp said.

Booked on an open charge of murder following the shooting was Kathy Dixon, 22, whose parents owned the Turquoise Bar and Rock Shop where the shooting took place.

Knipp gave this account of the incident.

"About 8:30 p.m. Sunday we received a call that a shooting had occurred at the bar. Through preliminary interviews with witnesses, we determined that a fight had taken place between Mr. Hammons and a male bartender."

"During the scuffle, Miss Dixon allegedly obtained a pistol from behind the bar and fired one shot. Our preliminary reports from the pathologist indicate that Mr. Hammons was killed instantly."

Witnesses told deputies that Hammons was shot after he struck the bartender and chased him into a back room. The undersheriff said that Hammons apparently was shot with a 38-caliber revolver. The bullet severed the spinal cord, deputies said.

Hammons lived in Willcox for more than 10 years before moving to the Ceccon Ranch near Courtland three years ago. He worked as a maintenance man for the State Highway Department.

Mr. Hammons was born on Feb. 16, 1934 in Greenup County, Ky. and moved to Willcox in 1963 from Batavia, Ohio.

Services were scheduled to be held this Thursday at 2 p.m. at Westlawn Chapel in Willcox, with Elder Lester Patterson officiating. Burial was to follow at Sunset cemetery.

Mrs. Hammons is survived by his wife, Frankie of Courtland; three daughters, Debra K. ## HANCOCK

December 31, 1937. Judge **J.C. Hancock**, of Paradise, Dies of Heart Attack Wednesday; Came to Galeyville Early in 1880.

James Covington Hancock, pioneer resident of Cochise county and for the past several years postmaster at the old mining town of Paradise, died about midnight Wednesday night from an attack of heart disorder.

The postmaster had been in his normal health and, only a few minutes before he was stricken, was sitting in his home with his daughter's family, in unusually jovial mood, laughing and relating experiences of the earlier days of his residence in the vicinity of Paradise. He died as he had frequently expressed the hope he might pass, quickly. Funeral services will be conducted in Paradise this morning at 10:30 and burial will be on the slope of the mountain south of Paradise, where lie some of the pioneers with whom the deceased lived when Galeyville and Paradise were active mining camps.

James Covington Hancock, or Judge Hancock as he was more generally known, because of the fact he had served for many years as a justice of the peace for that judicial district, was a native of Indianapolis, Ind., born July 27, 1860. When he was but 17 years old, his parents removed to California and he got his first experience, as a boy, in the west while the family home was at Santa Barbara, Calif. When he had resided there for about four years he was attracted to the territory of Arizona, then one of the active gold mining areas of the west, and the most thrilling center being Tombstone and Galeyville, the latter now merely a memory, not rating even as a "ghost town."

With a companion he traveled across the country to Tucson in a mountain wagon drawn by a team of mules which they disposed of at the old pueblo. Mr. Hancock continued his journey in 1880 to Galeyville, where he lived for a time, and then took up his residence in the town of Paradise, and had made that his home since, living there for more than half a century.

On July 20, 1898, he was married to Miss Laura Wood, who survives him. Children born to them who survive him are Earl L. Hancock, El Centro, Calif., and Mrs. James C. Kennedy, Paradise.

Judge Hancock had engaged first in mining efforts, when he came to the then territory of Arizona, but soon got into the cattle ranching business with James Whitehead as partner, their range being in the San Simon valley. He continued in that for many years, Paradise being his general headquarters. Several years ago he retired from the cattle business and had since lived in Paradise where he served as a member of the school board for the district, justice of the peace when that was a judicial district, and finally as postmaster. He often referred to himself as what Mark Twain had described as "the concentrated citizen."

The judge saw the Paradise area develop from a "wild and woolly" mining camp into one of the most interesting and delightful communities of the state of Arizona and he proved to be one of the most loyal citizens of it. He took great interest in following the history of the state and he was meticulous in his statements concerning the early incidents of the community when the real thrills were being experienced in the mining camp. He condemned some of the stories told in later publications, declaring much of the books were more like pure fiction than the facts as he had known them. He was widely known in southern Cochise county.

February 1, 1939. John Hands Dies Tuesday to End Long And Active Career As Pioneer Miner, Rancher and Archaeologist of State. E. John Hands, pioneer of Cochise county, noted amateur archaeologist, miner, cattleman, conservationist and prospector, died in his 72<sup>nd</sup> year early Tuesday morning at the county hospital after an illness of several years. The body is at the Porter-Ames mortuary.

E.J. Hands was born at Kingsweston, close to Bristol, England, on Nov. 1, 1866. Among the places he lived in early childhood are: Monks Kervy Pailton, England; New Bold Revel, England, which is located near Rugby and the Village of Hansworth, which was said to have been named after his family.

He first entered school at Bitteswell, England. Also attended school at Lutterworth, well known as the place where John Wesley started Methodism.

Then the Hands family moved to the Island of Raasay, close to Scotland, where his father was head game keeper of a shooting estate.

At the age of 13, he left school and went to work in nursery at Forres, Merishire, Scotland. This was a very large nursery, and plants were shipped to practically all parts of the world. It was Mr. Hands' duty to see that the plants

were properly packed and shipped. In spite of the responsibility, this position paid very small wages and he was forced to seek employment elsewhere.

The Southern Pacific Railway company had issued booklets encouraging immigration and telling of the wonderful opportunities in the United States, and especially Texas, so Mr. Hands decided to immigrate. In November, 1884, as an 18-year-old boy, he ventured to America alone. Landing in New York, he drifted through the southern states, finally arriving in San Antonio, Texas. He later drifted to Ballenger, Texas, where he teamed up with two other youths, George Walker and Joe Walker, and they all started for Arizona in 1887. They had been informed that there was considerable mining activity in the Chiricahuas below where Paradise is now situated, so they obtained a small contract and took up mining.

In the summer of 1888, Mr. Hands' brothers, Frank and Alfred, joined him from the old country, and they lived for some time at Silver creek, not far from where Paradise is now located. It was there that Alfred Hands was killed by renegade Indians on March 28, 1896. The slaying of Alfred Hands, as far as records are available, marks the final Apache slaying in Arizona.

After the death of their brother, Frank and John Hands developed the Hilltop mine and eventually sold out to larger interests. During the years to follow, they gradually acquired property, which gave them quite extensive holdings in the Chiricahuas.

A letter written to Mr. Hands by Fred Winn, supervisor of the Coronado forest, last November serves to indicate something of the position held in the minds of people who knew him, by John Hands. The letter says in part, "You have always been such a loyal conservationist and have rendered so much service to the cause that we who are yet able to carry on never cease to regret your illness."

Walter Zipf, a newspaperman who, for several years, was employed on The Bisbee Daily Review, in a series of biographical sketches on great men of the southwest, dubbed John Hands the "Major-Domo of Desperation Ranch." Desperation was the name of the beautiful ranch home John Hands built in the Chiricahuas.

The ranch is situated near the mouth of Cave creek on the east side of the range. Zipf writes of Mr. Hands as a "pioneer settler, frontier miner and prospector, cattleman, amateur archaeologist of note and persevering and indefatigable collector of rare antiques of the vanishing American."

The collection gathered over a period of about 14 years by John Hands is regarded by experts as one of the finest and most varied in existence. Mr. Hands started his collection after making a trip to the temple of Cuicuilco, a ruin in Old Mexico. He went there with Dr. Byron Cummings of the University of Arizona to direct excavation operations.

When the excavating had uncovered the ruins Mr. Hands became interested in the things that were found and from that time on he devoted much of his time to collecting relics of past ages. He became an expert and won recognition of noted scientists. John Hands worked at amateur archaeology as an assistant and an able one, to Dr. Cummings and others without pay. He donated his services for the pure love of the work.

John Hands came to Arizona over a route almost identical with that now taken by U.S. highway 80 and his first camp in the state was at Galeville. John worked for wages as a miner and mucker. He prospected on his own. His brothers, Frank and Alfred, joined him and they located the ranch which Alfred tended while Frank and John prospected. They rediscovered the workings at Hilltop and founded the mining camp there.

It was soon after that that Sheriff John Slaughter and the United States troops tracked the Apaches into the Pedregosa mountains, where they raided the Apache camp and John Slaughter found the Apache baby girl which he took home to Bernardino ranch. The child was burned to death a few years later.

John Hands produced evidence of irrigation projects thousands of years old in the Cave creek country and found the ruins of a large pueblo at Mud Springs, about 15 miles north of Douglas. He found pictographs at what is known as the Johnson ruins in Sulphur Springs valley.

The amateur archaeologist uncovered carvings at the Westfall ranch and pit houses in Leslie canyon. He declared many times that people here did not realize the vast scope of archaeological activity possible in their own back yard. Mr. Hands never married. He is survived by three brothers, Ernest A. Hands, still a resident of England; Frederick A., resident at Patterson, N.J., and Percy A., of Ukiah, Calif.

These have been notified of the death. Funeral arrangements are pending word from the brothers, which is expected this morning.

In 1953, he came to Willcox to sell grain storage buildings and farm equipment. He moved his family here in 1956. He had his own farm equipment business, Agricultural Sales and Service, until 1962 when the property on Haskell was sold and what is now the Desert Inn Motel was built.

Johnny then started selling real estate and in 1965 obtained his broker's license. He's been involved in the real estate business in Willcox ever since.

He was also instrumental in organizing AFTOS International, which held reunions of the men involved in the Mexican epidemic. He was the president of that group and presided at two reunions. The first attracted 125 persons and the second more than 250.

He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Willcox. He was also a past president of the Historical Society and president-elect of the Willcox Kiwanis Club. He was the co-chairman of the Willcox Centennial celebration and a charter member of the Willcox Elks Lodge. Johnny was also instrumental in organizing the Cowboy Hall of Fame and co-chairman of the Founder's Day Celebration. He was also chairman of the Cochise County Board of Adjustment.

Survivors include his wife, Catherine; two daughters, Linda Moser of Willcox and Brenda Halverson of Phoenix; three sons, Johnny of San Diego, and Michael and Jeffery, both of Tucson; one brother, Chris of Tempe; four sisters, Marie Rost of Willcox, and Josie Griffith, Lelia McGrew and Louise Passage, all of Phoenix; 15 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

February 13, 1931. A Beloved Pioneer Passes To Beyond. **Edwin R. Hooker**, the most widely known and best beloved and respected pioneer of this section, passed away in Los Angeles Wednesday evening, February 4<sup>th</sup>. He had been ailing for some time but was improving. He spent several weeks with Mrs. Hooker and his sister, Ida H. Stewart, at Mineral Wells, Texas, but recently returned to Los Angeles and was expecting to return with Mrs. Hooker to the Sierra Bonita Ranch in the near future.

Mrs. Hooker recently underwent an operation in Los Angeles and both were in the hospital. Wednesday evening he seemed to feel quite well and retired as usual, then he painlessly fell into the long sleep that knows no awakening.

Mr. Hooker was born in Placerville, California, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1861, and lacked only a few days of having attained the allotted three score and ten years. He received a good public school education which was supplemented by a business course in a San Francisco business college. His father, Col. H.C. Hooker, having established the Sierra Bonita ranch in 1872 and the family moved to the ranch in 1875, it was necessary to travel by stage to San Diego, and from there by boat to reach San Francisco, as the S.P. railroad was not constructed to Tucson and Willcox until 1880 and 1881.

Upon the death of Col. Hooker, E.R. Hooker and his brother and sister took over the management of the Sierra Bonita ranch, and in 1927 he and his sister bought the brother's interest.

Ed Hooker, as he was familiarly called, was for over twenty years the leading spirit in the management of the Sierra Bonita ranch. He demonstrated remarkable business ability and was one of the best posted and most successful cattlemen in Arizona. His kindly disposition, his charity, and benevolence to everyone in distress, and his splendid hospitality in which he was ably assisted by Mrs. Hooker, made him beloved by everyone who came in contact with him, and this community feels keenly its loss by his departure.

The beautiful funeral services of the Episcopal Church were conducted at the family residence in Los Angeles. Thereafter, cremation took place at Hollywood, and his ashes were placed beside those of his mother and father in the Hollywood cemetery.

He leaves surviving him his wife Mrs. Petite S. Hooker, a daughter Mrs. Forestine Froelich and a son Harry E. Hooker, a sister Mrs. Ida H. Stewart, and a brother Joseph M. Hooker, all residing in Los Angeles.

October 3, 1952. Funeral Services Set For Harry Hooker. **Harry Hooker** who had been up and about his business Tuesday but complained of not feeling up to par, died unexpectedly at five o'clock in Safford hospital bed where his doctor had put him with the idea that Mr. Hooker was to have a complete physical checkup. He was found by one of the nurses who noticed that the newspaper which he had been reading was spread over his face. Funeral services are to be held in the Methodist church here Saturday morning at ten o'clock with burial at the ranch.

The Sierra Bonita Ranch of which Mr. Hooker was owner was visited by many groups of people for two reasons, one for its historical value because it is one of the oldest established ranches in this section of the country and second because of the successful methods Mr. Hooker used in his three way operations, ranching, farming and feeding. Mr. Hooker has been adding to one of his newest projects right along, his feed mill and cattle fattening project, until he was sending from his feed pens approximately 6,000 head of cattle yearly.

Although other ranchers would try other breeds and cross breeds, Mr. Hooker has stayed with the Hereford, thinking it superior to any other breed for this section of the country. It was his grandfather, Col. Hooker who had brought some of the first Hereford bulls to this section and who had urged other ranchers to improve their ranch herds.

The ranch was established in 1872 quite by accident. Col. Hooker had the contract to sell meat to the various army posts throughout Arizona. These cattle were bought and were driven on hoof all the way from Oregon to down into old Mexico. One evening after camp had been established, the cattle sought the watering hole they could smell. The next morning when the cattle were located they were around a large cienega which had a bountiful supply of water.

Here the Col. established his headquarters, built a home which was completed in 1875, planted cottonwood trees, and made his place one of the most outstanding ones in the country.

The home which he built of adobe in Spanish style still stands and has been used as a home continuously ever since. It was built around an inside court which has green grass in it the year around. Much of the black walnut furniture which was freighted here from their San Diego home had come from the east and had been brought by boat around the Strait of Magellan. The furniture is still being used at the ranch.

During the time the Colonel and his family lived on the ranch, their hospitality was known far and wide. They entertained many of the nation's great including painters, writers, authors and others. The hospitality has continued through the years and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hooker have entertained many large groups of people at their ranch.

Mr. Hooker was one of the charter members of the Rotary club and served as its president in 1942-43. He also served the Cochise-Graham Cattle Growers as its president one term.

Mr. Hooker was born Aug. 2, 1888 in Los Angeles, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Hooker and the grandson of Col. and Mrs. Hooker. He spent many of his childhood days in the Sierra Bonita Ranch riding mile after mile with his grandfather.

It was in 1913 that he married Jessie Peck of Los Angeles. They have one daughter, Jacqueline, affectionately known as Rinky. She is now Mrs. Wm. Hughes of Palisades, Calif. Their grandson is Charles Hooker Davis of Pacific Palisades and Mr. Hooker has one nephew, Forrest Froelich of Willcox.

The Col. took to horse racing and had some of the best horses in the country. Every summer the Sierra Bonita horses were taken up and down the coast where they were entered in events. Instead of horses Harry Hooker drove and built racing cars and operated automobile businesses. These occupations prepared him for the work he was to assume in 1933 for that was the year he took over the complete management of Sierra Bonita ranch.

Mr. Hooker had a marvelous program for the development of the ranch. He considered it a trust to be handed on in better condition than it had been given to him. He studied all the scientific ways of ranching, feeding and farming and was an authority on all of the three subjects.

Dec 30, 1945. Two Are Killed Here In Train-Auto Crash. Two persons were killed instantly Saturday afternoon as the car in which they were riding was hurled 100 feet when struck by a Southern Pacific troop train eight miles east of Douglas. The dead: Mrs. L.A. Mobley, about 55, wife of the owner of Mobley's ranch, and a long-time resident here. **Robert E. Hubbard,** about 66, 451 Ninth Street, a worker at the ranch. The accident occurred at 12:50 p.m. at the crossing on Booster Station road, near highway 80. The car, struck squarely in the side, was thrown through a cattle guard and sent somersaulting into a ditch, witnesses said.

Mrs. Mobley's body was found near the track 80 feet from the scene of the crash. Hubbard's body was entangled in the wreckage of the car.

The automobile, a 1940 model Chevrolet club coupe, was completely demolished.

Mrs. C.H. Jeffers, who lives near the crossing, said she witnessed the accident from her backyard. "Mrs. Mobley was driving toward town from her ranch on a road which parallels the railroad track," she related. "the train was only a few feet behind the car. The whistle blew several times. I watched the car, expecting Mrs. Mobley to stop. Instead, she rounded the corner and drove right into the path of the train. Apparently the car windows were closed and she didn't hear the whistle. The train struck the Car with a terrible crash."

Mrs. Jeffers said she rushed to the accident scene. Mrs. Mobley and Hubbard both were dead, she related.

The train stopped at the crossing several minutes, then proceeded into Douglas.

Hubbard's body was removed from the car wreckage an hour later. Both bodies were taken to Brown-Page.

Peace Justice E. L. Steward, who investigated the accident, said an inquest will be held as soon as members of the train crew can be contacted.

Police said the wreck brought to five the number of persons killed in the Douglas area during 1945 in automobile accidents.

Mrs. Mobley, well-known in Douglas, is reported to have come to Arizona in 1900 from Texas. She lived in the Gila River area before moving here.

The Mobley ranch in recent years has been the scene of many barbecues and rodeos.

Hubbard, who also has lived here several years, was employed until recently in the supply section at Douglas army air field.
