Mr. Takagi was a former Willcox resident and graduated from Willcox High School. He was a veteran of WWII and Korea. He served with the Famed 442nd Nisei Infantry Co. "C" 100th Battalion Japanese/American unit and was a highly decorated soldier. He received the Korean Service Medal with three Bronze stars, National Defense Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster, Good Conduct Medal, EAME Ribbon, WWII Victory Medal, Occupational Medal from Italy Marksman Badge with Carbine Bar and the Expert Badge with Missile Bar. Mr. Takagi helped build the first Electronic Radar Telescope at Kitt Peak.

Father Dube officiated at the triple funeral which was held at the Catholic Church at six o'clock Saturday evening. So large was the cortege of cars that some remarked it was the largest funeral ever held in Benson.

The community felt it would like in some small way to show its sympathy to the bereaved grandmother, Mrs. Madrid, who not only had lost her three grandchildren but her home, so a purse of money was taken up with many people generously giving, with over \$300 being collected.
